## *A Note from Our Pastor, Fr. Keith*

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, more commonly known as the Feast of Corpus Christi. I personally invite everyone to attend our deanery Corpus Christi Mass this Thursday at 6pm. Parishioners and priests from our neighboring parishes will join us to celebrate our evening of the regional novena of Masses to begin the third year of the National Eucharistic Revival. Please mark your calendars if you have not already done so to join us for this special Mass.

As the summer begins, many people travel for vacations. Summer travel is a blessing and privilege compared to those less fortunate. Remember, a vacation from home does not mean a break from participating at Mass. We do not need to feel like the Mass is a burdensome or inconvenient obligation; instead, it is an invitation by God to spend quality time with him. Planning ahead by visiting [masstimes.org](https://www.masstimes.org) ensures Sunday Mass is the most important part of your vacation away from home.

There are extremely rare situations when Mass may not be available near a vacation destination. For example, majority Muslim countries sometimes have only one sanctioned parish in a region. Please consider emailing me about a dispensation from participating in Mass on a particular weekend if your vacation destination does not have a nearby parish. See the two pertinent sections of canon law below:

Without prejudice to the right of diocesan bishops in canon 87, a parish priest, in individual cases, for a just reason and in accordance with the prescriptions of the diocesan bishop, can give a dispensation from the obligation of observing a holy day or day of penance, or commute the obligation into some other pious works (can. 1245).

If because of lack of a sacred minister or for other grave cause participation in the celebration of the Eucharist is impossible, it is specially recommended that the faithful take part in the liturgy of the word if it is celebrated in the parish church or in another sacred place according to the prescriptions of the diocesan bishop, or engage in prayer for an appropriate amount of time personally or in a family or, as occasion offers, in groups of families (can. 1248.2).

As Catholics, we take this obligation seriously, so much so that deliberately missing Sunday Mass may be a grave matter. If choosing such a grave matter is done freely in full knowledge, then it may even be a mortal sin, unless someone is sick. As I honestly shared with you in a homily a few months ago, I understand the dilemma about our time on weekends. The saddest day of my deployment was missing Mass on a Sunday due to my military travel off the installation. I was able to go to confession the next day because there was an Air Force priest traveling through the area.

The next time I anticipated a travel conflict, I wrote to Archbishop Broglio for a dispensation from Sunday Mass so I could travel to Iraq. He permitted me to transfer my Sunday obligation to the previous Friday because my military flight pattern would take the whole weekend. Planning ahead allowed me the opportunity to request a dispensation. I anticipate some may consider this reminder about obligation and mortal sin to be offensive or archaic. However, I am speaking from personal experience and pastoral care. As we continue this third and final year of the Eucharistic Revival, let us grow in our appreciation for the gift of the Eucharist.

### **Donors Needed for One-Time Special Second Collection**

#### **CORPUS CHRISTI (6/1-6/2)**

On the weekend of June 1st and 2nd, when we celebrate the beginning of the third year of the National Eucharistic Revival, we will have a one-time special second collection to fundraise for requested liturgical enhancements. For example, many parishioners have asked Fr. Keith to install a hymn board displaying the page numbers instead of printing in our bulletin. They feel it would be better than flipping back and forth between the bulletin and hymnal. It may even help increase participation at Mass. We are ready as a community to complete our gradual transition from printed worship aids, our current mixed model of hymnal and bulletin, to only using the hymnals. The hymn board will be installed at an angle on the sacristy wall near the choir area for maximum visibility in our church. We ordered the largest commercially available size. At the same time, we placed an order for kneelers for our altar servers. We were using the small attached kneelers at the back of the chairs when we resumed altar server ministry after the pandemic. We changed to using a single, longer kneeler which is still too short for three servers. Now, each altar server will have their own kneeler to better accommodate three servers at the 4pm and 11am weekend Masses. The manufacturer for both the hymn boards and kneelers is New Holland Church Furniture, the same company who made all of the pews in our church. Our goal for the special collection is \$4,500. Please consider making a donation for these useful additions to our sanctuary. Any amount collected above our goal will be used to save toward the expected \$10,000 to complete the digitization of our sound system. Many parishioners have shared their concerns and feedback with Fr. Keith about the sound system. Unfortunately, we ran out of funds to finish the \$32,000 of digitization already completed in February.

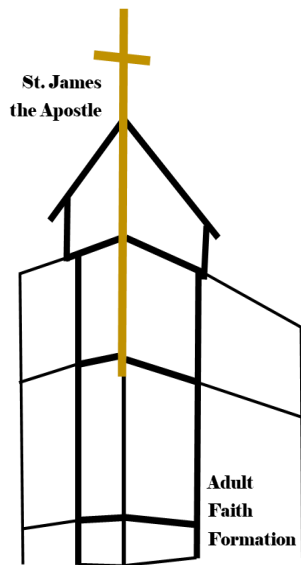
