A Note from Our Pastor, Fr. Keith

Thank you to everyone who generously participated in our one-time, special second collection two weeks ago. Your generosity through this collection and the ongoing “Preserving Our Father’s House” envelopes provided \$12,571.41. We will be able to order and install the new hymn boards and complete the second phase of our sound system repairs. We will need to address the third and final phase of our sound system repairs in the very near future to eliminate the feedback and replace the burnt fuses. This helps us lovingly maintain our church just as we do for our own homes.

On the same weekend, we celebrated the Feast of Corpus Christi. The Eucharist must become the focus of everything we do at the parish. You may notice in the bulletin that each Mass is offered by the priest for a particular intention. For example, the Code of Canon Law obligates the pastor to offer one Mass on a weekend for the people of the parish (534.1). The parish priest is obligated to fulfill this requirement if Masses for the people of the parish have been omitted from the parish calendar (534.3). A priest may only offer one Mass per day with a single intention (905.1). However, a priest may offer up to three Masses in one day on Sundays and holy days. Sacramentally, we describe the Mass as a holy sacrifice because it is a re-presentation of Christ’s definitive sacrifice on Calvary.

Historically, the faithful provided an offering to the priest for a particular Mass intention. This offering is canonically described as a stipend. A mass stipend for a particular intention was the only source of subsistence for a priest as is the case in many poorer countries today. At the same time, by offering a stipend, the requestor was making a sacrificial offering of their own. Mass stipends are not buying or selling sacramental grace like the sin of simony. In fact, Church law forbids even the appearance of such sin (947) up to punishing a priest with a censure (1385). The Mass is offered for the intention not the offering.

The priest may offer a Mass for multiple intentions, however, the parish may only keep the stipend or offering for one intention. In the Diocese of Joliet, the offerings for Masses with more than one intention are sent by the parish to the cemetery fund for the maintenance of these sacred spaces. The Diocese of Joliet interprets the law about multiple intentions to allow two Masses per week with an additional intention. For example, at our parish, we have one weekend Mass with two intentions and one weekday Mass with two intentions. Some parishes do not adhere to this policy by having as many as five to ten intentions per Mass! This is unfair to the requestors and their families.

These laws fairly administer a deeper, more important spiritual reality. It is objectively beneficial for someone, living or deceased, to receive the sacramental graces of a Mass offered for them. Anecdotally, it is said that President Kennedy may be the American with the most Masses offered for him because he was our first Catholic president at a time when many Americans were still religious. At any rate, please prayerfully consider requesting more Mass intentions. It is better to celebrate a Mass with an intention instead of without an intention.

At the same time, many parishes also offer the opportunity to dedicate the sanctuary lamp each week for a particular request. The red Sanctuary Lamp by the tabernacle burns to remind us of the sacramental presence of Jesus Christ. It is a mark of honor to remind the faithful of the presence of Christ, and is a profession of their love and affection. The suggested dedication for the candle is \$30. It will burn for one week. The dedication will be published in the bulletin.
