## A Note from Our Pastor, Fr. Keith

Last month, our neighbors at Saint John the Baptist Parish in Winfield celebrated their Corpus Christi Masses just like all the other churches in the Diocese. However, their celebration looked slightly different than the rest of our neighboring parishes. They celebrated the Mass *ad orientem*, meaning the priest faced with the congregation toward the tabernacle during the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Many people experienced this liturgical form of worship for the first time so it may have seemed new, innovative, or even strange.

Interestingly, celebrating Mass *ad orientem* is not an innovation. Indeed, it was the standard direction of liturgical prayer from the beginning of the church until 1969. The Latin phrase *ad orientem* translates as the preposition *ad* (toward) and *oriens* (rising, sunrise, east), a participle of *orior* (to rise). Simply, *ad orientem* describes the eastward direction as a spiritual and liturgical posture inherited from Judaism. Jews, Muslims, and Christians share the eastward direction of prayer as a symbolic connection to the Temple, Mecca, and the Mount of Olives respectively. Eschatologically, Christians pray easterly as a spiritual direction toward the awaited new day of creation.

The rubrics of the General Instructions of the Roman Missal provide the instructions on how to celebrate Mass. There are no rubrics instructing or even suggesting *versus populum*. On the contrary, the instructions themselves presume the Liturgy of the Eucharist is celebrated *ad orientem* because they explicitly instruct the priest to turn from the altar to the people only seven times during Mass: (1) at the beginning, the priest turns from the presider's chair to the people when making the Sign of the Cross, (2) during the offertory and preparation of the gifts, (3) the exchange of dialogue at the start of the Preface, (4) offering of the sign of peace, (5) when saying "Behold the Lamb of God" while holding the Host and Chalice, (6) closing prayer, and (7) at the blessing and dismissal.

All of the twenty-four *sui juris* (autonomous) churches comprising the worldwide Catholic Church have retained the unbroken tradition of eastward liturgical prayers except for the Ordinary Form of the Roman Rite. Just this month, for example, Pope Francis has mandated *ad orientem* direction for the Syro-Malabar rite. Eastward prayer has been maintained in the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite, more commonly known as the Traditional Latin Mass. Many Protestant denominations retain *ad orientem* for their worship, like Anglicans. Locally, several of our neighboring parishes have already restored this ancient practice, including Notre Dame in Clarendon Hills, Saint John the Baptist in Winfield, and Sacred Heart in Lombard.

Since 1969, we have had several generations of American Catholics who never experienced *ad orientem* worship because nearly all churches celebrate Mass *versus populum*, facing toward the people. It is a curious misstatement when people refer to the difference between *ad orientem* and *versus populum* as "the priest with his back to the people." The more accurate phrasing would be "the priest facing *with* the people *toward* God." Analogously, why would you want a pilot to fly an airplane facing toward the people seated in the cabin instead of toward the windows in the front?

The implementation of the liturgical reforms after the Second Vatican Council was abrupt. The reformers never mandated a change in the liturgical direction at Mass in *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy. I did not live through the implementation period after the Second Vatican Council, so I do not feel qualified to comment on the reasons why the implementation was so different from the text of the constitution itself. Nonetheless, their abruptness and innovation is an example of what to avoid if other parishes restore this ancient practice during the National Eucharistic Revival. May Our Lady of Guadalupe, Mother of the Eucharist, continue to encourage our focus on the Eucharist.
