A Note from Our Pastor, Fr. Keith

The National Eucharistic Congress begins this week. Catholics from around the country will meet in Indianapolis for a week of prayer, catechesis, and community as a part of the National Eucharistic Revival. Providentially, I have the opportunity to attend two days of the Eucharistic Congress on Thursday and Friday. I will be one of tens of thousands of people gathered to celebrate the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

We need to remain focused on renewal even after the Eucharistic Revival ends next year. The National Eucharistic Revival has been an opportunity to evaluate the overall spiritual condition of our parish. Everything we do must be focused on the Eucharist. We need to raise awareness, inspire urgency, and focus on renewal. The responsibility for evangelization is shared by everyone. It is not the professional work of clergy and religious. Renewal and evangelization begins at home. It is the responsibility of the laity to hand on the faith to the next generation by fulfilling their baptismal promise to raise their children and grandchildren in the practice of our faith.

Many parishioners share with me their sadness about their children and grandchildren having abandoned the practice of our faith. Their sadness usually accompanies regret for fear of "forcing" religion on their children and grandchildren during formative years. I share your sorrow because I am often one of the youngest people at Mass, despite being closer to forty than twenty. At the same time, we can joyfully imagine fuller pews at Mass because "hope does not disappoint" as Saint Paul wrote to the Romans.

Concurrently, we need to acknowledge and address our practical challenges so we can focus on our spiritual challenges. The temporal welfare of the parish must support the spiritual welfare of the parishioners. I have been sharing the same three questions with all of you over the past two years in my homilies, bulletin articles, and formation presentations. Do you want to be the last Catholic in your family? Do you want to be the last generation of Catholics at St. James? If not, what will we do about it?

Last month, I met with Alexander Buldak, the Mission Lead from the Department of Catechesis and Evangelization at the Diocese of Joliet, to learn more about so-called "Evangelization Quads." I was concerned about this concept being yet another program or activity which eventually fades at every parish. His idea emphasizes training a small group of parishioners from diverse backgrounds and ages to re-evangelize absent Catholics in our local community.

Please prayerfully consider if you feel called to this evangelical response to the questions in the paragraph above. Alex will be discerning who to train after we identify interested parishioners. Ideally, we would have four parishioners of different ages, experiences, and backgrounds to evangelize our own community. Only a minority of practicing American Catholics believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. This is a spiritual crisis demanding our response. Concurrently, we need to address the temporal needs of the parish to fully focus on the long term spiritual vitality of our parish.

Bishop Hicks has asked all of the parish pastors to communicate with our respective parishioners about the ongoing targeted restructuring in the Diocese of Joliet. In response to his request, I will be writing about this vital issue next weekend to raise awareness, inspire urgency, and focus on renewal. I invite you to read this weekend's article and next weekend's article with a spirit of encouragement as an opportunity for evangelization, especially at home.

Finally, as we included in last weekend's FlockNote, I am sharing with you an update about staffing in the Religious Education Office. Lisa Weesner has accepted a position at a different parish effective immediately. We are grateful for her combined fourteen years of service to our RE program. Please join me in praying for a qualified candidate as we form a hiring committee to select a new Director/Coordinator of Religious Education.


Parish Office Closed July 17, 18, 19 For the National Eucharistic Congress






