Service Opportunities Based on the Works of Mercy

Feed the Hungry:

- Volunteer at a local soup kitchen
- Collect donations to provide Thanksgiving Dinner for those in poverty. Check with places like the Outreach House in Lombard https://www.theoutreachhouse.org/get-involved
- Make a meal for someone who is going through a hardship like the loss of a loved one, or has just welcomed a new baby.
- Pick up leftovers from a bakery or restaurant and deliver to a food bank contact these facilities prior to your arrival
- Work a shift at Feed My Starving Children https://www.fmsc.org/get-involved/volunteer/
- Volunteer your time at a food bank https://www.volunteer-northernilfoodbank.org/youth-volunteering/
- Help the Knights of Columbus at a pancake breakfast
- Assemble food baskets for the needy

Clothe the Naked:

- Participate in or organize a clothing drive to collect winter clothes for places like the Outreach House in Lombard, PADS, or Bridge Communities in Glen Ellyn
- If you know how to knit, crochet, or sew, create hats or blankets to donate to those in need
- Participate in a Christmas giving tree. Get involved by helping to deliver the gifts collected.

Shelter the Homeless/Welcome the Stranger:

Comfort the Sorrowful:

- Visit a cemetery and pray a rosary for those who have died this is especially a wonderful idea on the Feast of All Souls Day November 2nd

Pray for the Living and the Dead:

- Make a prayer list of people you know who are sick and pray for them every day.
