A Note from Fr. Keith, Our Pastor

It is a joy to announce the selection of Mary Ellen Upchurch as our new Music Director. You will have an opportunity to read more about Mary in this bulletin. Please join me in extending a warm welcome to her during her first weekend with us on November 9/10. I am grateful to the members of the hiring committee, especially Ray Klein and Geri Niwranski, who prayerfully and collaboratively evaluated, interviewed, and selected our new Music Director.

We agreed on selecting a candidate who will provide sacred music that is accessible, familiar, and participatory instead of performative. We need to bring stability to this ministerial position after several years of turnover and change. We want to renew and restore our choir and cantor ministries with a focus on supporting the whole congregation in singing.

During this time of transition, it is opportune to share some initial liturgical updates going forward. The documents, instructions, and rubrics of the Church inform these updates. Therefore, beginning with the new liturgical year on the First Sunday of Advent (December 1, 2024), we will be implementing the following liturgical updates:

- Eulogies will, once again, no longer be permitted at the Mass of Christian Burial. Fr. David implemented this policy before my arrival. Over this year, we attempted to resume permitting eulogies which frequently neglected to mention the spiritual life of the deceased. The *Order of Christian Funerals* (§170) provides, “a member or friend of the family may speak of the deceased before the final commendation begins,” however, the most recent edition of the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* states, “At Funeral Masses there should usually be a short Homily, but to the exclusion of a funeral eulogy of any kind” (§382). Families are encouraged to offer remarks at the visitation (wake), after the committal (burial), or at the luncheon.
- Finally, the weekend announcements will be moved from within the Mass itself to before the beginning of the Mass. The cantor or vocalist will be reading the announcements before the customary greeting and introduction. It is important to take a bulletin home with you, visit our website, and read the weekly FlockNote, in order to stay informed about the many events at our parish. We want to keep the focus of the Mass on the Eucharist itself.

Thank you in advance for your support for these liturgical updates. I realize some of our neighboring parishes may not be in conformity with these universal instructions, rubrics, and documents. However, our fidelity to these norms from our bishops is a collective response to the reverence called for by the National Eucharistic Revival. May Saint Cecilia, the patroness of musicians, continue to intercede for our parish!

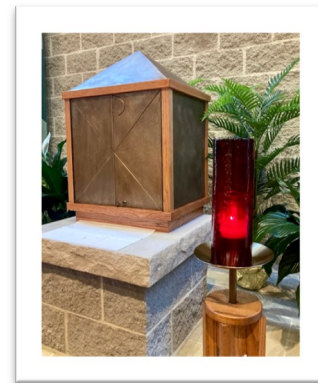

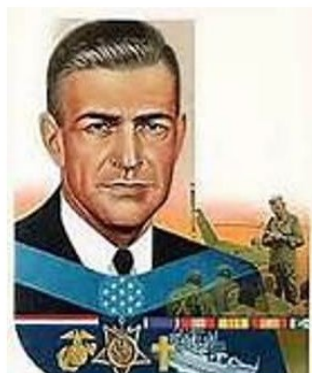
