## *A Note from Fr. Keith, Our Pastor*

This weekend is the first anniversary of my return to the parish after my combat deployment for overseas service. Some parishioners have been encouraging me to share about my experience. In response to their encouragement, I am reflecting on the highs and lows of these past twelve months since coming home despite preferring to focus the community on the Eucharistic Revival. First and foremost, I am most grateful for the many parishioners who have supported me during this challenging year by welcoming me home.

I have shared with some of you about my military service while other parts are too sensitive to share. My orders were to Qatar but I spent a significant amount of time downrange in Iraq and Syria ministering to our servicemen and women in combat. Reintegration into civilian life and parish ministry has been challenging because of these experiences. Reintegration, socially and emotionally, has been delayed by many unforeseen personal and professional stresses throughout this last year.

The joy of my return to our parish began with the celebration of Mass on All Saints Day in 2023. My stress worsened by the untimely death of two of my cousins only a few weeks later. I was honored to concelebrate their combined funeral Mass in Maryland. My personal grief was combined with professional stress to repair the rectory in anticipation of the unexpected move by the Bishop-emeritus. As you know, some significant repairs to the physical facilities of our parish had been deferred for years due to financial constraints.

Professionally, the full scope of our reduced attendance, deteriorated facilities, and underfunded budget, left me with some of the most difficult challenges I have ever faced as a priest ordained less than ten years and a first time pastor. In addition to this stress, along with the delayed opportunity to address my combat experience, there was the unexpected hardship of the vocal minority of dissatisfied parishioners. I was unable to meet the expectations of this vocal minority wanting me to have the personality traits, decades of experience, and initiative of past pastors of St. James.

According to Bishop Hicks, my greatest gift to our parish is the combination of my military discipline, honesty, and functionality under significant pressure, along with my relative youth, and, most importantly, my commitment to Eucharistic faith. Gratefully, the majority of parishioners have been supportive during these challenges. You have encouraged and supported me with understanding and compassion. You have stepped out of your own comfort zones to embrace the Eucharistic Revival and our emerging vision for renewal and evangelization.

Reintegrating as a combat veteran, Bishop Hicks directed me to better self-care as a priority, even over ministry and work, so the short term healing process will enable me to have a long term vitality and effectiveness as your pastor. To that end, he provided me with a counselor, professional consultants, and healing retreats. I am grateful to Bishop Hicks for his wisdom in assigning me to St. James from July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2028. During these six years, with the possibility of a second term together, could you please extend to me the compassion of allowing me to be myself without comparing me to previous pastors? Most importantly, I am grateful to be a priest of Jesus Christ who is the High Priest and the true pastor of St. James. Lastly, thank you to everyone who participated in our inaugural Welcome Weekend last Sunday. It was a great success!

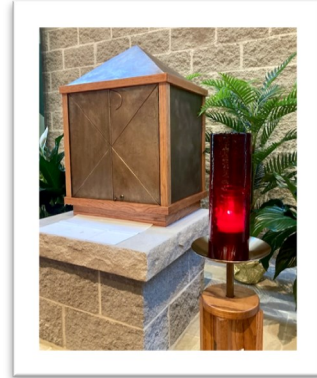

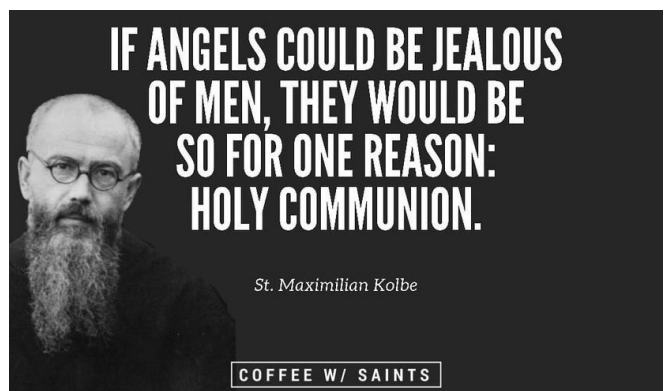

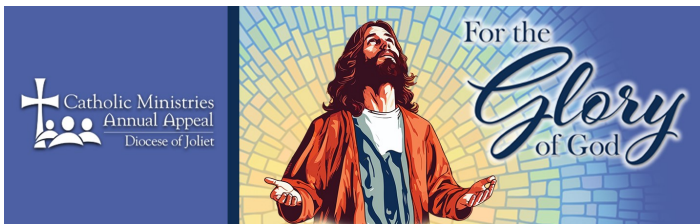

**Speaker:** Anne Roat, The USA Council of Serra International President and member of Serra Club of Lafayette, Indiana



Anne Roat first encountered Serra in 1992, when she was invited by the Chaplin of the Lafayette Serrans to speak about her ministry as a Director of Religious Education at her parish. The local club was composed mainly of men and later welcomed both single and married women. In 2004, Anne and her husband Bill joined the Lafayette Serra Club. 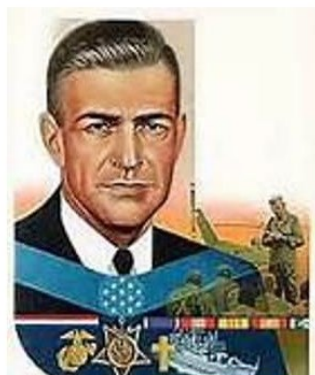
