A Note from Fr. Keith, Our Pastor

Thank you for the messages of support last week while I was in Florida for my silent retreat. I was grateful for the many people who shared their condolences with me in light of my grandmother's passing. I celebrated her Mass of Christian Burial in Naperville this past week. She was an integral part of my vocation to the priesthood. May God grant eternal rest to her soul and consolation to my family. Thank you for your patience and understanding with my absence over the past three Sundays for my retreat, bereavement, and Navy reserve duty. I will resume normal availability on Tuesday.

Sacred means "to be set apart," as in different from ordinary things or spaces. Sacred spaces should feel different from other places like a bank, store, or even our own homes. If sacred spaces are different from other places, then perhaps we should act differently in them too. The encouragement for restored reverence is worth considering by all of us. Reverence is our faith-informed respect for God and the spaces where we worship him. This respect extends to our fellow parishioners in the pews.

As we reflect on the sacred, we can consider certain timeless suggestions for etiquette to be reverent at Mass:

- Genuflect. Before entering a pew, we genuflect toward the tabernacle as a gesture of respect for Our Eucharistic Lord.
- Silence. Many people like to pray before and after Mass. Conversation can be held in our spacious narthex instead of in the pews out of respect for people making an act of preparation or thanksgiving before and after Mass.
- Time. Mass starts at 4pm on Saturday and 9am and 11am on Sunday. We can anticipate that life is busy and messy, so we should give ourselves adequate time to be at church before Mass begins instead of arriving late. Additionally, we can take time after Mass to thank God for his Eucharistic gift instead of leaving Mass early.
- Focus. We live in a world of distractions competing for our attention. By silencing or even turning off our smartphones we can minimize these distractions for ourselves and others to focus more attentively at Mass.

We should acknowledge generational differences in etiquette. For example, younger generations are used to dressing more casually whereas older generations would see it as offensive to wear anything less than your Sunday best. Instead of judging others for how they might dress at Mass, perhaps we can all try to develop and practice an "interior Sunday best" of genuflection, silence, time, and focus. These actions are more than just a courtesy. Again, they are acts of reverence to respect the sacred as something altogether different than any other place we spend our time during the week.

Lastly, after consulting the Parish Office Staff, neighboring parishes, and local Funeral Homes, we will implement an additional liturgical update effective on the First Sunday of Advent (December 1). We had been offering the option of hosting a visitation before a funeral Mass in our narthex. Fr. David implemented this option before the pandemic. However, we can no longer support the option of hosting visitations (wake services) in our narthex due to the staffing limitations, inaccessible kitchen space during school hours, and other limited resources like furnishings. Local funeral homes have the resources, facilities, and staff to support visitations in a respectful and dignified way. As always, thank you for your support and understanding.






