Sunday, November 24, 2024 | Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

A Note from Fr. Keith, Our Pastor

Many Americans will gather with their family and friends on Thursday to celebrate Thanksgiving. Our civic holiday has religious origins even before the Pilgrims celebrated the generosity of local native tribes and their faith in God. Abraham Lincoln established the civic commemoration of Thanksgiving during the Civil War explicitly to encourage gratitude to God. His proclamation acknowledged the "gracious gifts of the Highest God, who, while dealing with us in anger for our sins, hath nevertheless remembered mercy." Unfortunately, our society has distanced itself from both the grateful purpose and religious meaning of Thanksgiving.

Corporatist consumerism has diminished the significance of Thanksgiving by encroaching on the day itself with unrestrained consumerism. The night before Thanksgiving is the busiest day of the year for alcohol sales even more than New Years Eve. Black Friday deals for shopping interrupt family dinners. Small Business Saturday promotes local shopping after Black Friday. Cyber Monday advertises online shopping. The advertising sprint ends with Giving Tuesday for charities. How do we reclaim the fourth Tuesday in November for gratitude?

I encourage every household to include in their dinnertime two practices to reclaim the meaning of Thanksgiving. First, you can begin your meal with a prayer to thank God for the blessings your family and friends received over the last year. Second, you can invite each person to share one thing for which they are thankful. Scripture reflects these two suggestions with praise, "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever. Give thanks to the God of gods, for his steadfast love endures forever. Give thanks to the Lord of lords, for his steadfast love endures forever" (Psalm 136). Gratitude is the beginning of generosity!

After Thanksgiving, my most ardent suggestion is preserving the integrity of Advent by avoiding the Christmas creep of music, decorations, shopping, etc. The Liturgical Season of Advent begins next weekend with the end of the Liturgical Year. Advent is not Christmas. We celebrate the Liturgical Season of Christmas from Christmas Eve (December 24, 2024) through the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (January 7, 2025) with some European cultures continuing until the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (February 2, 2025). Once again, Advent is not Christmas.

Advent is a season of preparation for Christmas by penance much like Lent penitentially prepares for Easter. If you feel inspired to reclaim the meaning of Advent, then I invite you to join us for our Advent events listed in next weekend's bulletin. Please save this schedule as a reminder throughout December. In particular, I invite you to attend the Advent Holy Hours on Thursday, December 5 and 12 at 7pm with Exposition, Adoration, and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Additionally, please mark your calendars for Vespers (Evening Prayer) with Exposition, Adoration, and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament every Sunday of Advent at 4:30pm on Sunday, December 1, 8, 15, and 22.

As an aside, I thank you in advance for your support of the Seminarian Endowment for the Diocese of Joliet. We are blessed to welcome seminarian Joshua Solarz at all the Masses this weekend to speak about his vocation story. Your generosity directly impacts the future of our Church by supporting the formation of future priests. He will be speaking after Communion. Please extend to Josh a warm welcome. Long live Christ the King!

As you make your plans for Thanksgiving on Thursday, November 28th, we invite you and your family to start your holiday celebration at our 9:00 A.M. Mass.


